

Staveley Sunday, 25th January, 2026

'B' WALK Staveley Circular Walk

Approx 8.2 miles

This is a reasonably challenging 'B' Walk due to recent wet weather conditions which have left us with muddy paths and slippery stiles. The walk uses a variety of grassy/stony paths and tracks, several stiles and some road walking. Stout boots and poles are advised.

The route takes us from the Mill Yard through pastures towards Frost Hole passing forests and waterfalls on the way. The path rises steeply towards Potters Tarn and we are rewarded by good views of the surrounding countryside. We head towards Dales Way passing Gyll Pool following the river toward the railway line. From here we find our way to Ashes Lane and head back into Staveley.

We shall stop en route to use toilet facilities. Refreshments can be obtained from a couple of establishments on The Mill complex. The Eagle and Child public House is located on Kendal Road.

C WALK Potter Tarn Loop

Distance 6.05miles

WE start our walk from the side of the Chapel, we will follow the river towards the Sewage Works, (this path may be quite muddy)

We then follow the country lane towards Hundhow, from here we slowly make our way up hill towards Potter Tarn. Lovely view from here if it is a clear day.

We then make our way across the moors towards Birk Field making our way back onto a country lane towards Littlewood Farm, we continue on this lane for about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile, going towards Hall Lane.

We then go across country, back on the fields towards Low Elfhowe, and we pick up the country lane, making our way back to the river all the way back to Staveley

There are a few stiles to cross but they are steps up and down.

This walk maybe quite muddy in places so bring your walking poles.

We will stop on the motorway about 8 miles from Staveley to use the toilets as they are out of order in the town.

The coffee shop by the Brewery is serving till 4pm.
